Tibet has produced one of the world's most unique spiritual and artistic traditions. Since the introduction of Indian Buddhism over 1300 years, and sheltered behind the world's highest mountains, the Tibetan Himalayas have produced an indigenous form of Buddhist monasticism, in which art and architecture play an important role. Tibet's ancient monuments were built based on a blend of Buddhist beliefs and highly-developed arts, crafts and building skills. This presentation will give an overview about Tibet's artistic traditions and important monuments, starting with the founding of Lhasa city and the first Buddhist temple in Tibet 1300 years ago. It will also outline some of Tibet Heritage Fund's (THF) latest projects which include recovery of a 10th century Buddhist stone carving, the design and construction of a museum for Ladakh, restoration of a 14th century monastery in Amdo, and the restoration of a 13th century temple in Ladakh. The Dalai Monastery Restoration Project in Mongolia recently brought THF its second UNESCO Award of Excellence in 2009. THF is an international non-profit organization, founded in 1996 to preserve Tibet's rich artistic heritage and to support a revival of traditional crafts. Andre Alexander has worked on the study and preservation of historic Tibetan monuments for the past 18 years as co-founder and director of THF.
